### What constitutes a basic site?

- Provides information to end-user with little to no complex features
- Personal advertising (i.e. portfolio, service, etc.)
- Small businesses that haven't reached
  enterprise level



### **Why Drupal**

- Almost everything needed to build a basic site can be done through the UI
- Flexibility in creating content and pages
- Ease of maintenance post launch
- Can be done with little to no Contrib modules\*

\*depending on specific needs



- Modular code made to execute specific action or handle certain events
- Not plugins
- May require some configuration
- Flexible and able to be molded to fit specific site needs




